
Nell Murbarger holdings at the Nevada Historical Society, Reno

"We have not yet created a finding aid for the collection, but I am attaching two lists: the typewritten one is the original inventory that accompanied the deed of gift when she donated the material in 1975; the handwritten one seems to have been done by a volunteer going through the manuscript collection.

I cannot guarantee the accuracy of either of these lists at this point, but it's at least something to start with.

You'll see within the first document that they separated out a large number of photographs and put them into the general photo collection. There were also artifacts included with the donation."
